Charleston County Announces New Environmental Management Director

New Director begins on May 9



Charleston County Government has hired a new director for the Environmental Management department. Andrew Quigley will begin on May 9.

Mr. Quigley has been employed for the past nine years as the Director of the City of Tucson's Environmental Services department. He also served as an Interim Assistant City Manager with the city.

Previously, he was the Executive Director of the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County, Illinois, a 41municipality environmental services agency serving a population of 700,000, north of Chicago. He also worked in Fairfax County, Virginia as Deputy Director of the county's Solid Waste division.

"Mr. Quigley has deep knowledge of the industry and is a direct, straight-forward communicator," said County Administrator Keith Bustraan. "He is skilled in talent development and possesses a collaborative working style with employees, elected leadership and peers and we are happy to welcome him to Charleston County."

Mr. Quigley's entire career has been in local government and he has managed large landfills, developed waste transfer stations, managed and contracted collections routes, composting operations, and recycling processing contracts. He introduced a compressed natural gas fleet of collection trucks in Tucson which is more cost-effective over the long term. He also has served as a past president of the Solid Waste Association of North America.
