Traffic Alert: Nighttime Closures on Bowman Road for Johnnie Dodds Boulevard Project

<u>Charleston County Government</u> announces road work as part of the <u>Johnnie Dodds Boulevard</u> <u>Improvements Project</u> in Mount Pleasant.

Bowman Road Lane Closures:

- Drivers should expect minor, nighttime delays from 9 p.m.-6 a.m. on Thursday, May 26 on Bowman Road.
- The lane closure will affect eastbound and westbound traffic near the West Frontage Road intersection (by Arby's restaurant).
- The construction area will be marked with construction cones.
- The lane closure is necessary to place asphalt on this portion of Bowman Road.

Drivers traveling through the construction zone are asked to be aware of equipment and crews working in the area. Alternative routes are recommended if possible. The public is also asked to notice traffic control signs, reductions in speed limit and message board information, and to note that all road work is dependent on the weather.

The goal of the project, which is expected to be completed in the fall of 2012, is to improve the traffic flow in and out of Mount Pleasant, especially before and after school and work hours.

The project is funded by the <u>Charleston County Transportation Sales Tax</u> and managed by <u>Charleston County Government</u>'s RoadWise Program, in close coordination with the <u>Town of</u> <u>Mount Pleasant</u> and the <u>S.C. Department of Transportation</u>.
