Charleston County Remains at OPCON 4 for Hurricane Irene

Operating Condition 4 means an emergency or disaster situation is possible

[Charleston County Government](#) participated in a conference call today (Thursday, Aug. 25) regarding Hurricane Irene. The call was initiated by the [S.C. Emergency Management Division \(SCEMD\)](#) and included representatives from several counties.

Based on the information learned in the conference call and the storm's current track forecast, **Charleston County will remain in Operating Condition (OPCON) 4. Charleston County continues to maintain contact with State and local emergency management agencies discussing the projected landfall of Irene.**

OPCON 4 means there is a possibility of an emergency or disaster situation that may require a partial or full activation of the Charleston County Emergency Operations Center (EOC). Emergency support functions that would be needed in the event of an extreme change in the storm's projected path remain on stand-by.

"Right now in Charleston County, we are expecting mostly marine activity from Irene. That means rip currents, high seas and possible beach erosion starting on Friday and continuing through Saturday" said Cathy Haynes, [Charleston County Emergency Management Department's](#) Chief of Operations.
