Economic Development Receives International Excellence Award

Silver Excellence in Economic Development Award received from International Economic Development Council

<u>Charleston County's Economic Development Department</u> received a Silver Excellence in Economic Development Award for their Paid Advertising Campaign in the category of Paid Advertising Campaign for communities with populations of 200,000-500,000 from the <u>International Economic Development Council (IEDC)</u>.

"We are very pleased to receive this international honor," said Charleston County Council Chairman Teddie E. Pryor, Sr. "We are a world-class business destination and our website and advertising campaign is a reflection of that."

The announcement was made during the IEDC Annual Conference in Houston in early October.

"We recognize Charleston County Economic Development for creating innovative and successful strategies to promote economic development in this period of global recovery," said Jay Moon, IEDC chair. "Our awards honor organizations and individuals for their efforts in creating positive change in communities. Charleston County Economic Development demonstrates that they are at the forefront of the economic development profession and are using cutting-edge, effective practices that can be replicated in other communities."

Charleston County Economic Development chose Atlas Advertising (Denver, CO) to design a logo and create an advertisement campaign as a prelude to developing their departmental website. They began this project by inviting the Atlas team down to Charleston for an intensive, three day immersion tour. The result was an inventive, ground-breaking marketing campaign that they could utilize both online and in print. The theme is "History lives here, but that's not all," and the tagline is "Historically Forward Thinking".

"The goal was to broaden outsider perspectives on the Charleston area," said J. Steven Dykes, Charleston County's Economic Development Director. "Charleston is widely known as a beautiful and historic tourist destination, frequently winning awards from the likes of Condé Nast and Travel + Leisure magazine. The new campaign sends a strong message that Charleston County is also a premier place to do business."

During 2012, Charleston County Economic Development's ads have premiered in print and on line, in publications such as SC Biz and SC Commerce magazine. It is also on their home page of www.charlestoncountydevelopment.com.

"With its innovative workforce, favorable tax climate and the deepest port in the Southeast, businesses are perfectly positioned to join local corporate leaders as they continue to make history and set trends," Dykes said.
