Resilience Updates

- Hazard Vulnerability Assessment

- FEMA Changes + County Response

County Council approved staff implementing nine (9) recommendations, May 8, 2025.

- #4 Prioritize Hazard Mitigation Keep resilience projects moving, even without federal grants. Invest in county flood control, fire prevention, power and water contingencies, and critical infrastructure protection.
- #5 Move Fast on Resilience Projects Currently in Pipeline For example, all major HUD-funded mitigation and FEMA-funded flooding projects should be accelerated if possible while funds exist, and carefully monitored so that any federal policy shifts don't derail them
- #9 Deepen Private Sector, Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs), and Faith-based Relationships – Strengthen partnerships with these organizations who can offer shelter, food, and recovery resources faster than we can.
