





Vulnerability and Risk



Disproportionate Impacts

- Pre-existing social stressors that exacerbate climate impacts
- Tangible and intangible community assets important to safety and well being of underresourced residents
- Areas with concentrated social and physical vulnerability

Strategy Development

- 1. Develop resilience objectives
- 2. Identify options covering broad strategic areas
- 3. Multi-criteria prioritization



FernLeaf will largely play a facilitative role in this phase

Key Outputs of the Project

- Shared understanding and synthesis of key climate-related vulnerabilities across the County
- Preliminary set of strategies and actions for further evaluation, refinement, specification and prioritization
- Foundational information and analyses to enable the County staff to make informed decisions beyond the course of this project

RSAC Role

- Assist in interpreting the assessment results and help refine the framing of major vulnerabilities.
- Committee will be part of the collaborative effort with other stakeholders
- Provide comments on the draft project report

Quarterly updates during regular Committee meetings One-on-one engagements for specific feedback

County Staff Team

- Help tailor the analysis to local factors and context
- Co-develop insights from the assessment outputs
- Collaborate within and across departments to identify opportunities for action
- Refine a prioritization framework for resilience actions
