Green Liaisons' Printing Reduction Competition Kick-Off

What is Green Liaisons?

Green Liaisons is a group of County employees from each department focused on recycling and other sustainable practices within the County. Its first Countywide competition will focus on reducing printing in the office.

Printing Reduction Competition Details

The competition will be held from May to October 2022. The number of pages each department prints during this time period will be compared to the number of pages printed from the same time period in 2021. The department who has the largest overall percentage reduction will win a special prize!

Why is printing harmful to the environment?

Although a majority of paper is recycled, paper is still produced from cutting down trees which have a long list of positive environmental benefits including capturing greenhouse gases, reducing stormwater runoff which may reduce the effects of flooding, and serving as a habitat and food source for many species.

Another issue is the printer itself with additional energy used to power the equipment and toner cartridges which end up in landfills if they are not recycled and sent back to the company who produced them. Toner cartridges take an estimated 400 to 1,000 years to breakdown in landfills.

Some tips for reducing your printing:

- Print double-sided copies
- Go digital – for meetings, send presentations or other information, like agendas, to attendees in advance and display the information on a screen in the conference room
- Print in black and white whenever possible
- Choose fonts that use less ink – the weight of the letters affect how ink-efficient fonts can be – for example, Times New Roman, Calibri, and Century Gothic all outperform Arial in terms of ink usage

If your department or office doesn't currently recycle toner cartridges, follow these instructions below to start recycling:

RICOH: [Click here](#) and scroll towards bottom for prepaid tab. Keep the box that the new toner comes in and just fill it with the empty ones to send back.

Lexmark: If you get the toner option that is part of the Lexmark Cartridge Collection Program (LCCP) it comes with the label in each box. If you order an option not in the LCCP, you can [click here](#) to print a label - step 3 has the link for the label. You can request 1 or 5.
