During this process, your child will be asked questions about his/her use of drugs, educational achievements, family life, relationships with peers, as well as other topics. A counselor will also want to talk with you, the parent or guardian, to gain added awareness about your own perceptions of your teenager's behavior.

After the assessment has been completed, the counselor will meet with the treatment team regarding the specifics of your teenager's situation. The counselor will then call you with recommendations for services and any referrals if necessary.
