Charleston County Emergency Operations Will Move to OPCON 4 at Noon

[Charleston County's Emergency Management Department \(EMD\)](#) is monitoring the threat of Hurricane Irma in the Charleston County region. The Charleston County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) will move to OPCON 4 at noon today. OPCON 4 means there is the possibility of an emergency or disaster situation that may require a partial or full activation of the Charleston County Emergency Operations Center. Staff has participated in a conference calls with state and local agencies to remain up-to-date on the potential impacts.

Latest information from National Weather Service: South Carolina could see some impact from this storm however due to the uncertainty of the track it's not clear what those impacts will be at this time.
