Charleston County Remains at OPCON 3, Emergency Management Officials Monitoring Tropical Depression Four

Charleston County Emergency Management officials remain in close communication with National Weather Service, state, and local officials as they continue to monitor Tropical Depression Four and its possible local impacts.

According to the latest information from the National Weather Service, Tropical Depression Four is currently located off the coast of Cuba and is expected to pass over Florida as Tropical Storm Debby early next week.

The primary threats to the Charleston area include heavy rain (6-12 inches with localized amounts up to 18 inches), coastal and inland flooding, and tropical storm force winds. Local impacts are expected to begin as early as Monday morning.

Charleston County will adjust its operating conditions throughout the week as additional information about the storm and its path become available. The Emergency Operations Center will activate as needed in accordance with the county's shift in OPCON levels.

"While it's too soon to know exactly how this storm system will impact our area, residents should begin making initial preparations now to ensure they are ready for any scenario," said Charleston County Interim Emergency Management Director Ben Webster. "Make a plan, talk to your loved ones, and, as always, stay tuned to trusted sources for further information."
